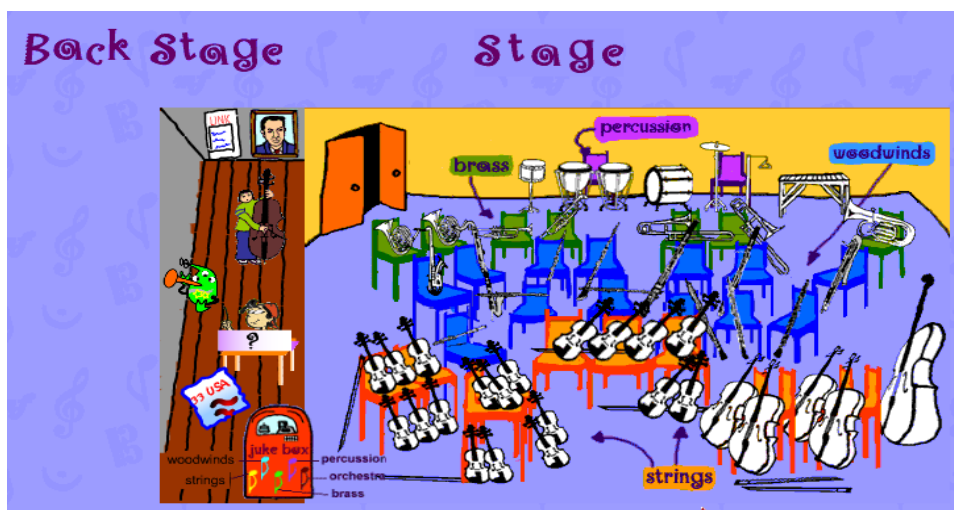
Following on from last term's 'World Music on the Web' article here are some more exciting and innovative websites to use in the classroom.

This website has a massive resource of lesson plans, singing activities, starter activities and free software downloads.

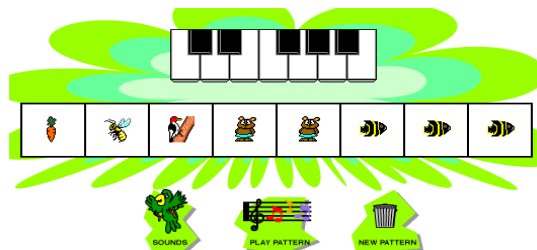
