How do I save a video from YouTube?	
1. Find the video you want to save. Highlight the site address (see right) and copy it (ctrl+c on a PC, cmd+c on a Mac).	
2. Go to one of the following sites, and paste the address into the box. Follow the instructions for your very own pristine copy of the video! Video = www.keepvid.com (FREE) Video and audio! = http://vixy.net/	

How do I save a video from BBC iPlayer?
